SUMMARY

- Opening prayers should be carefully selected so as to be inoffensive to all participants.
- Special care should be observed in the use of jokes and/or humorous anecdotes in an interfaith setting.
- Courtesy titles and appropriate expressions must be used in reference to the sacred personages and features of each faith.
- 4. Interfaith courtesy requires respect for other participants' beliefs, values and religious customs.
- 5. Respect for the individual's freedom of conscience and for what he or she holds in good faith should be emphasized and fostered.
- 6. Dialog does not authorize the minimizing of differences found in the opposite faith in the interest of agreement on a least common denominator or on only those elements held in common by both faiths.
- Exposition of basic beliefs should be done in a positive and affirmative manner not in a negative, attacking, or unfavorably contrasting way.
- 8. Special care must be taken to avoid the laying on of a load of guilt for past intergroup hostilities, wars, and/or persecutions.
