

The nine one hour programs will capture more than 3000 years of history of the Jewish people as seen within the context of Western civilization. HERITAGE explores how this small group of people influenced, and was influenced by successive generations of other peoples and by developments in the world at large.

The complete schedule for our tenth year will be forthcoming, and will include the regular lecture series plus several special events that are planned for our 1984-85 season - eg; the trip to Israel in the spring of 1985.
