She worked in Zaire, Africa from 1979 through 1982 with Habitat for Humanity supervising construction of low cost housing and coordinating community development projects. Included among these projects were literacy classes taught in Lingala, the regional dialect, French and English classes, an experimental garden, construction of a women's center using fire baked bricks made by the village women themselves.

Ms. Clark is presently a research person working with the Southern Poverty Law Center's Klanwatch Project. There she helps monitor the activities of the Ku Klux Klan and other white supremacist groups, including the Aryan Nation organization which has been notable in recent months in the press.
