2011 marks the 65th anniversary of the verdicts at the first Nuremberg trial, a watershed moment in inter-national justice, and the 50th anniversary of the trial of Adolf Eichmann, one of the most high-profile postwar recountings of the Nazi genocide and a landmark in public awareness of the Holocaust.
